CULTURAL PRACTICES: sow indoors in early March in light, sandy soil; cover the seeds with three millimeters of soil. There will be germination after three weeks at a temperature of 17 ° C. Transplant into individual pots when the plants are 2.5 cm high.

SOIL: rich in organic matter. A lack of boron will cause rotting in the center of the fruit and empty roots.

SPACING: place the plants in the garden in rich soil, at a distance of 20 cm to 30 cm between the plants in rows spaced at least 60 cm.

GROWING TIPS: make sure the soil stays cool. Cover with a mixture of compost and straw and water regularly when the rains are scarce (especially during the formation of the root).

HARVEST: harvest when the diameter has reached at least 10 cm to 15 cm. Keeps well in winter, in a cool basement.
