**CULTURAL PRACTICES:** make seedlings indoors in March in light potting soil. Transplant into a pot when the seedlings have two pairs of true leaves.

**SOIL**: light, humus-like and fresh.

**SPACING:** transplant to the garden, in full sun, as soon as the risk of ground frost has passed. Space the plants 30 cm apart in rows 60 cm apart.

**GROWING TIPS:** water regularly during the flowering period. Fertilize once (1) per month with a fertilizer rich in potassium.

**HARVEST:** the pepper is harvested about 5 to 6 months after sowing, that is to say in August for sowing in March. The peppers continue to ripen after harvest and their color changes for a few days. To keep peppers for a long time, they must be dried in the sun by hanging them by their peduncle. They can also be dried in the oven at low temperature, at 50  $^{\circ}$  C.
